Minutes of the Monthly Meeting of Stockton Parish Council Held in Stockton Village Hall at 7.30pm on 18th July 2022.

The Vice Chairman welcomed all to the meeting.

Item 1. Open Forum

Mr Sharples raised issues regarding the cemetery:

Dave Stanley has offered to paint the railings if the pc provides him with suitable paint. He also suggested forming an opening in the hedgerow between the old and new cemeteries. He is unhappy about the surplus soil from grave excavation being dumped in the far right-hand corner of the old cemetery. Not only is it unsightly but is in a position where it's going to be very difficult to remove. He wondered if the grave diggers should be asked to remove this surplus material from the cemetery at their own expense. In future it would be far better to allocate an area adjacent to the Radical when the soil can be stacked and removed periodically with a machine.

Mr Sharples also raised issues regarding the Playing Field:

The Scouts have made the landowners aware of drug-taking and sexual activities occurring in the hedgerow between the playing field and the scout field. The appropriate authorities should be notified

The Self-build scheme is now onto revision "S". Any positive comments / support for this application addressed to Charlotte Dicks, the planning officer dealing with the proposals would be very much appreciated. Once developed, this could go a long way to help resolve the anti-social behaviour we're currently experiencing

Mr Sensecall informed the pc that he was resubmitting a planning application for conversion of roof space at Lower Tomlow farm which had been refused on the basis that need had not been demonstrated. He was now seeking the support of the pc for his revised application. After a short discussion he was informed that pc can only respond once the application has been submitted.

It was proposed by Cllr.Kittendorf and seconded by Cllr.Warner that this apology is accepted - this motion was unanimously agreed.

County Cllr. Crump noted the ongoing considerations of Vehicle Activated Signs Policy and the Highway Verge Management policy.

Cllr.Crump noted the temporary overnight closures of the A426 during August Cllr.Crump noted the reporting of potholes by the crossroads.

Cllr.Crump noted that swimming in open water is not recommended and also warned about the dangers of BBQs in the current heatwaves. He suggested that people ring 111 when there are issues of this nature.

Cllr.Crump noted that the grant funding could support the initiative for Stockton Playing Fields.

Cllr.Crump noted the ongoing complaints, particularly on Facebook, regarding parking problems in Stockton, and reaffirmed his requests that people come to the pc meeting rather than moan on facebook.

Cllr.Crump noted that fire & rescue locations are being reviewed.

Cllr Adam informed the pc that the bridge at Marton on the A423 has now been removed.
